








Welcome to Kindergarten!

50/50 Bilingual Kindergarten Program

- High quality kindergarten programming is delivered in both French and English.
- There are no specific expectations for French language acquisition in the Kindergarten Program.
- Oral language is the focus; building communication skills (in English and French, as well as non-verbal skills)
- Each child will experience and grow in this program in a way that is unique to them, based on their unique developmental profile.



Extended Day Program (EDP)

- The OCDSB operates the Extended Day Program for children from Kindergarten to Grade 6 registered in their designated OCDSB school and where there is sufficient interest within the school community.
- Extended Day Programs are run either by the OCDSB, or by a third party provider in partnership with the OCDSB. Both types of programs are overseen by the Ottawa-Carleton District School Board. All programs have fees, you can find a list or programs and fees on the OCDSB website.
- Registration for EDP is a separate process from Kindergarten. Please ensure you have complete the registration process for any before and after school programs.

Both programs, offer safe and caring before school and after school options for your child.





Extended Day Program (OCDSB)

The OCDSB Extended Day Program is:

- A licensed program offered before and after the regular school day, governed by the Child Care and Early Years Act (CCEYA), and the Education Act.
- Delivered by Registered Early Childhood Educators and Early Learning Assistants.
- Required to maintain a ratios that are based on licensing requirements which are
 1:13 for Kinder with 26 children maximum in a group.
- Operates on most PA Days, some days over the Winter Break and March Break at select locations. Note: operation on these dates is dependent on demand, we reserve the right to cancel the service if we have insufficient demand.

Current Elementary Programs:

Full Day Kindergarten

• 50% English and 50% French

English with Core French

- Starts in Grade 1
- 200 minutes Core French per week

Early French Immersion

- Starts in Grade 1 (entry point) with 80% French/20% English
- Grades 2-6: 60% French/ 40% English
- Grades 7-8: 50% French/ 50% English

Middle French Immersion

- Starts in Grade 4 (entry point) with 66% French/34% English
- Grades 7-8: 50% French/
 50% English

Alternative Program

- Kindergarten-Grade 6 in 4 schools
- Grades 7-8 in 1 school
- Tenets shape the program
- 200 minutes Core French per week

Ottawa-Carleton Virtual School

- Kindergarten-Grade 8
- Offers English with Core French and Early French Immersion (50% French/50% English)





Current Elementary Resources and Supports

Special Education

- Support in the regular classroom
- 11 types of Specialized Program Classes (SPCs)

English as a Second Language/ **English Literacy Development**

- Support in the regular classroom (for ESL and ELD)
- Semi-congregated classes (for ELD)









Elementary Program Review

- The OCDSB is reviewing its elementary programs, special education supports and English as a Second Language supports.
- Spring-Fall 2024: The OCDSB gathered District data, external research and feedback from 4,294 respondents.
- January 2025: The OCDSB has proposed a new program model and will launch consultations to gather community feedback.

What is the Proposed Model?

 The OCDSB is proposing a new elementary program model with two pathways: Enhanced English and French Immersion. This aims to improve program quality and accessibility, focusing on community-based education, dynamic, bilingual teaching and learning environments and a continuum of inclusion.

This model will:

- Offer two streamlined program pathways: Starting in grade 1, students can choose between Enhanced English (EE) and French Immersion (FI). This simplified approach will allow the district to focus its resources more effectively and ensure program quality and accessibility.
- **Provide fluid entry points for French Immersion**: Students can enter the FI program at the start of grades 1, 2, or 3, making it more accessible.





What else is changing?

- The English with Core French Program designated as Alternative and Middle French Immersion (MFI) will be discontinued, with transition details to follow.
- Increased French instruction in the EE program and English instruction in the Grade 1 Fl program: This will provide a solid foundation in both official languages for all students.
- The proposed model includes changes to grade configurations, attendance boundaries and supports for diverse learning needs. A school locator that will allow parents and guardians to identify their designated school will be released to the public at the end of February 2025.





What about Supports for Students:

- Redistribution of Special Education Resources: Gradually phase out 39 of 142 specialized
 program classes and reinvest those resources to provide greater support within general classrooms.
 This shift will allow us to better meet the needs of a wider range of students with special education
 needs and foster more inclusive learning environments.
- Continuation of Supports for Complex Learning Profiles: 103 of 142 SPCs will remain in place.
- Robust support for multilingual learners: We will continue to prioritize in-class support with ESL assistance as needed and maintain ELD classes for students with limited prior schooling.
